Dear Dr. Gaster,


In continuation of my previous reports, I have the honour to inform you that the negotiations with Sir Mark being very favourable as far as British views and interests are concerned, made it again clear that further "Pourparlers" with M. Picot on behalf of the French Government are necessary.

In accordance with an understanding between Sir Mark and M. Picot, I am leaving to-morrow- evening for Paris where I am to meet M. Picot and others, and acting on the desire of both these gentlemen a common friend of theirs, Mr Malcolm, who is in sympathy with the Zionist cause is accompanying me on this trip.

I may have to stay there some time in order to await developments as well as get into touch, for the same purpose, with some other influential people. I shall keep you informed of the developments of my negotiations, and remain,
